



Sunflower Triangle Box

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Scrap Happens Here with Darla



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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- Stamps: Radiant Sunflowers Bundle (168359)
- Inks: Early Espresso (147114)
- Cardstock: Early Espresso (119686); Crushed Curry (131199); Lemon Lolly (161720)
- Designer Paper: Sunflower Fields (168351)

- Accessories: Radiant Gems (168383); Mossy Meadow & Very Vanilla $\frac{1}{4}$ " Gingham Ribbon (168364)
- Tools: Simply Scored (122334); Paper Trimmer (152392); Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine (149653); Detail Scissors (170902)
- Miscellaneous: Stampin' Dimensionals (104430); Tear & Tape (154031); Multipurpose Glue (116755)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Cut a 4" x 11" piece of Early Espresso cardstock and score it at $\frac{1}{2}$ ", $2\frac{1}{4}$ ", $5\frac{3}{4}$ " and $7\frac{1}{2}$ ". Turn it to the portrait position and score it at $1\frac{1}{4}$ ". Cut rectangle in corner completely off and flaps on all score lines, up to the $1\frac{1}{4}$ " score line. Add Tear & Tape and fold it into a box as shown in photos below.



2. Cut belly band measuring $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x 8" from Sunflower Fields Designer Paper Series. Score it at $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", $4\frac{3}{8}$ " and $7\frac{1}{4}$ ". Attach Tear and Tape to one end only. Fold the box on both sides to create a triangle. Fold the DSP around it for proper fit. Attach one end to the other using Tear & Tape. DO NOT ATTACH IT TO THE BOX.



3. Cut the front sentiment tag all with the Radiant Sunflower Dies, using Lemon Lolly cardstock, the sunflowers using Crushed Curry cardstock, the flower centers using Early Espresso.



4. Stamp the sentiment onto the Lemon Lolly cardstock with Early Espresso Ink. Add the flower center to the flower (you'll only need one) with Multipurpose Glue and attach the flower to the sentiment with a Stampin' Dimensional. Tie a bow from the gingham ribbon and attach it above the flower with a Mini Glue Dot. Last, attach the Radiant Gems.



5. Attach the sentiment to the box with Stampin' Dimensionals.
